Trying to reflect and sum up the whole of 2019 has been an odd experience, when our current reality is so scary and uneasy. Our galleries, venues, theaters, and performances are closed for the foreseeable future, and the whole world is in a state of unknown. But we are encouraged by the support we've seen for artists in our community! Keep it coming!

Since I started at Amplify (then OCI), every year has been "a big year". This time, I really mean it. 2019 was our first full year as Amplify Arts. As I've said in the past, this was a decision that kept me up at night (my fussy toddler may have also been a factor). But this past year there were many signs of confirmation that we made the right choice. We started out the year adding a new space and a new face to our team. In January we started programming out of the Generator Space on 18th and Vinton, and in February, Maggie Weber joined us as Development Director. The rest of 2019 was an amazingly fun blur of doing our favorite thing: awarding grants to artists. We also launched our Membership program and Alternate Currents, focused on making connections and starting conversations.

Each year Amplify's Board and Staff wield a chisel and continue to chip away at the block of granite that is Amplify Arts, molding it into a better version of itself. We are confident that our artist grants program has made a strong impact on individual artists on the micro level, and will continue to do so. In 2020 we are looking forward to working with artists and representatives from all areas of the arts sector to break down barriers that are holding artists back from their ideal careers, reshaping these systems on a macro level.

At Amplify we firmly believe that artists and the arts are essential and necessary to a healthy, thriving community—not luxuries, which has been the stereotype in the past. I think this moment in history has firmly demonstrated the essential—ness (Is that a word? Now it is.) of artists to our collective humanity. I don't know about you, but this experience has only strengthened my conviction in this belief. I hope you'll join us in continuing to support our local artists.


